The plan of Alma College Board for the relieving it of embarrassment was read and referred to the Committee on Education.

A communication from the Dominion Alliance for the suppression of the Liquor Traffic was read and referred to the Committee on Temperance.

A communication from J. C. Tufford was read and placed on the file.

A communication from Rev. J. R Jaques, D.D., President of Albert University, in reference to the College and its work, was read and referred to the Committee on Education.

A memorial from certain persons at Lobo, concerning the Burying Ground, was read and referred to a Special Committee of three, to be appointed by the Chair.

The Sunday School Union presented Report No. 1, which was adopted. (See Report). Committees called and Conference adjourned. Benediction by D. W. Kelly.
