

Arctic steamer Terranova, which went
te the reliaf of the Fishia Ziegire polar
expedition, has rescued Anthony Fishs
and all the others connected with the
expedition, with the exception of one
Norwegian seaman, who did from natural causes. The ship America, which
cok out the expedition, was crushed in
the loc early in the winter of 1993.4,
and lost with a large part of her coal
and provisions.

The 37 members of the expedition
who returned to safety are all in good
health despite their privations and
trying experiences, and their prolonged
imprisonment in the Arctic, the expedition having been severed from all
communication with the outside world
since July. 1993.

Anthony Fishs of Brooklyn, N. Y.
the leader of the expedition, in a brief
statement, sagrs:

The rescue was most timely. By
my order, the America wintered
in Neplitz Bay, where, early in the win
ter of 1994, the ship was crushed in
the lice and became a total loss, tog
