

WEEKLY WEATHER SYNOPSIS.

Victoria Meteorological Office.

April 24th to 30th, 1907.

The weather during the past week has been exceptionally fine, and no precipitation has occurred in British Columbia.

Day temperatures have been somewhat higher, but night frosts have been general, and during the latter part of the week have caused some little damage to strawberries and early vegetables in districts where vegetation is more advanced.

The controlling factor in this fine weather has been the barometric pressure, which has been chiefly high and with not much variation in its distribution. The winds have been variable and light to moderate in force. Owing to the dry weather bush fires have occurred both on this island and the Lower Mainland.

In the prairie provinces the weather has continued unusually cold and scattered snowfall has occurred.

In the Yukon it has become decidedly warmer.

At Victoria there were registered 78 hours and 30 minutes of bright sunshine, being a daily average of over 11 hours.

The highest temperature was 64° on the 24th, and the lowest 32° on the 28th.

At New Westminster—Highest, 64° on 24th; lowest, 32° on 28th.

At Vancouver—Highest, 65° on 24th; lowest, 32° on 28th.

At Kamloops—Highest, 70° on 23rd; lowest, 26° on 27th.

At Barkerville—Highest, 50° on 23rd; lowest, 16° on 27th.

At Port Simpson—Highest, 60° on 25th; lowest, 20° on 25th.

At Athol—Highest, 63° on 26th and 27th; lowest, 15° on 24th.

LOCAL NEWS.

Deceased had been an inmate of the institution for some time and underwent two serious operations while there. He was well known in the city, having been a resident of Victoria for sixteen years, eight years of which he spent as engineer at the Phoenix brewery.

—During the month of April the fire department answered ten calls, six of them false alarms. The property loss for the month was \$900, the most serious fires being at Loo Gee Wing's building on Flanagan street, the Standard laundry and C. Laurie's residence on Belmont avenue. The losses at the above fires were, respectively, \$150, \$400 and \$150.
