Rev. J. M. Maclean presented the C. R. report on Wednesday morning, and papers on Young People's work were read in connection.

On Wednesday the cases were made remanded.

In case No. 5 the case of the day, including the actual expenses of John McKeay, a material witness, who was now on his way from Roseland, were paid by defendant hearing by consent to be in St. John before His Honor Judge McLeod next week.

Chatham Town Council. A special meeting of the Council was held Wednesday evening. There was a full attendance.

From Governor General's Secretary acknowledging message of sympathy regarding the Queen's death.—Filed.

From G. J. Spruel asking permission to connect a sewer from laundry to St. John street, and to lay a pipe from the laundry to the water tank.—Referred to Board of Works.

From J. Lahey asking that his name be placed on tax list in order to avoid paying license, as he intended making his restaurant business permanent.—Referred to By-Laws Committee.

From Mr. Fisher regarding land for waterworks.—Filed.

From the City Band, asking that the \$1000 granted by the town be paid over to the band as was in need of two new instruments.

On motion, Mr. J. J. Noonan, President of the band was heard, and he explained that the band was not asking for another \$1000 but simply for the payment of the \$1000 already granted. All the instruments would be handed over to the Council and the holder of each instrument would have to give a bond to the Council for the amount of it, and if same was damaged the party (or the band if necessary) would have to make good the loss. The band could not continue without new instruments, as members who owned some had left town, and as the band had already given their services free, to the extent of \$200, he thought the Council should pay over the money. It would not be giving the money away—the town would receive instruments to the value and more than the value of \$100. The Council already referred this matter to a committee who failed to meet the band, and if the matter has again to be given to a committee, don't give it to men who are so timid.

On motion of Ald. McKeay the Mayor was authorized to pay the \$1000 and W. C. Winslow was instructed to draw up the necessary papers for the town to take over the band stock.

Ald. McDonald & Co., amounting to \$20, for opening a sewer on Queen st.—Referred to Board of Works.

The Mayor read a letter from W. C. Winslow stating that the petition to the legislature was ready for the Mayor's signature and Town seal.

Ald. Maher moved that the Mayor and Clerk sign the petition and affix the Town seal, and that Mr. Winslow forward same to Fredericton.

The Mayor read the document and Ald. Watt argued that it was not correct as it contained the section relating to voting without paying taxes, which section was not passed by Council.

Ald. McKeay moved an amendment that the petition lie on the table and a proper order be prepared.

Ald. Watt seconded the amendment.

The Mayor read a letter from Hon. Mr. Tweed saying not to worry him by sending him resolutions, but to send proper bill to legislature and he would look after it.

Ald. Watt said that Mr. Winslow's petition was too long and there were so many copies of resolutions in it that the members of the legislature would be bothered reading it all.

The amendment was put and the vote stood 4-4—the noted four. The Mayor voted for amendment.

Ald. Galloway moved, seconded by Ald. Maher that Mr. Winslow be appointed to go to Fredericton to look after legislation asked for.

Ald. Watt moved an amendment, seconded by Ald. McKelvey, that the Mayor be authorized to appoint delegate or delegates to go to Fredericton to assist the passage of legislation asked for, if necessary.

The vote again stood 4-4—the faithful four—and the Mayor voted for amendment. Adjourned.

The Council met in special session on Monday evening.

Photos of Messrs. Munroe, Letson, Morrison, McCully, Doyle and Ward, returned South Africa heroes, all neatly displayed in an oak frame, were presented to the Council in behalf of the donor, ex-Ald. P. E. Neale, for the adornment of the Council Chamber. The gift was, on motion of Ald. Maher, seconded by Ald. Marlock, accepted with the Council's thanks to Mr. Neale.

The Mayor, having reported the resolution of the ratepayers' meeting on the subject of the purchase of the Electric Light Company's plant and franchise, he was, on motion of Ald. Watt instructed to sign a petition for a bill to authorize the \$20,000 issue of bonds.

Applications of Geo. Pollock & Allison Dock to be placed on the assessment list, or allowed to pay a nominal license fee, instead of being required to pay for a regular business license, they intending to become residents and start a tin shop in the town, was referred to the bye-law committee with power to act.

A letter from engineer Coffin, of Boston, was read, enclosing several contracts for water works supplies; also recommending that the contractor for the proposed stand pipe be required to submit evidence that every pipe used by him for that work has passed the required tests.

Ordered that such a provision be inserted in the contract.

The Mayor was, on motion of Ald. Watt, authorized to sign the contracts with Drummond and McGill for hydrants, \$2,145.50; the Resolvaer Valve Co. for valves, \$1,284.70; Robertson for the sewer pipes; with the Montreal Pipe Co. for the iron water pipes, and with J. M. Reddock for the standpipes and special castings.

The Mayor read the following letter: To His Worship the Mayor.

Sir: I have been requested by a number of our citizens to draw attention of the Council to the fact that the building on the corner of Wellington and Ontario streets, formerly used as a church, is being changed into a steam laundry.

I do this in order that all necessary rules and regulations to secure the safe construction of the building, and to protect the premises may be complied with to protect property against loss or damage by fire.
