Vimy Ridge War Memorial

Ridge is to be delica'ed in 1934. According to the London Observer, it is "the most remarkable memorial on the Western front". The memorial stands over the famous Grange Tun nel, a vast network of underground galleries excavated during the war and used as assembly trenches for the troops in the battle of Vimy Ridge. One of these subterranean works was truck when the foundation was built. The architect is Walter Allward, a Canadian.

The whole of Europe was searched I'm a stb., e that, in such an exposed position as Vimy, would weather and endure for centuries. This was found near where were fired the shots that hastened the Great War. Mr Allward leasd an old Roman quarry in Yugo-Slavia that had not been worked since the fourth century; from this quarry 8,000 tons of stone have been shipped to-France.
