## FIRST AID SAVED RAILWAY MAN'S LIMB

Battle Creek, Nov. 29.—The value of first aid instruction in big industrial plants has been demonstrated in a striking manner. An accident in the Grand Trunk shops resulted in one of the men having his right leg broken in two places. The case was handled in class, and on the patient reaching the hospital the surgeons called in the whole nursing and student staff to see the manner in which the splints and bandages had been applied. The doctors stated that if the man had been moved without this expert care there would have been a very serious chance of his losing the limb or being lame for life. They stated that this was a first class case of a fracture of this nature coming to the hospital from an industrial plant that had received proper first aid.
