MESS-HEATERS FOR THE ITALIAN SOLDIERS.
Old newspapers are worth their weight in gold in Italy at the present moment, and an appeal has been made in America through "Il Cittadino," an Italian newspaper in New York, that as many as possible be collected on this side of the water, from whence they will be sent as expeditiously as the work can be carried out, free of charge to the other side. These old papers are glued together, rolled up, dipped in grease or paraffine and are to serve as "scoldieroni" (mess-heaters) for the Italian soldiers. Legions of boy scouts are employed in the fabrication of these paper "logs" and are said to turn out about 300,000 daily. "L'Illustrazione Italiana" assures us that over two million have already been sent to the front, and that work shops are springing up everywhere like mushrooms for the manufacture of this novel and extremely useful commodity.
