MANY RETURNED SOLDIERS WILL SPEND TODAY IN CITY

Large Party Arrived Early This Morning - Major L. B. Gauthier and Lieut. W. F. Carroll on Way to Attend Parliament - Lieut. E. S. Roxborough of 140th Also in Party.

Among the returned soldiers to arrive in this city this morning are Major L. B. Gauthier and Lieut. W. F. Carroll, who are returning for the session of parliament. The party consists of 27 rank and file. There are five members of the 26th Battalion in the party and several members of the 25th. The wounded from the 26th are Privates Cyril Campbell, John McDermod, Harry McGowan, Alex. McDonald, William Pitt, Lieut. E. S. Roxborough of West St. John is also with the party.

Twenty-seven of the men will receive their discharge from this depot and the remainder will leave by special train this morning for the west. A train will leave West St. John consisting of 11 cars, 4 baggage, 4 tourist, 2 dining, 2 hospital sleepers and 2 standard sleepers, after the returned soldiers' Reception Committee have presented the boys with parcels containing fruit and smokes. There are nine amputation cases which will be treated by the Hospital Commission at their artificial limb factory.
