The D. G. Aberdeen has been

to take up her new division in the Bay  
of Fundy fishhouse and buoy service.  
Barge Reached Norfolk.  
The giant barge Neosho, in tow of  
the tug Norfolk, arrived at Norfolk  
Thursday from this port, where she  
had put in for repairs.

The barkentine Reas Murphy arrived  
at port yesterday with a full cargo  
of molasses from Barbados.

Kingdom, deals. Three hundred and  
forty shillings is the highest price  
quoted this spring.  
Maritime Miscellany.  
Sine Olinda (Cuban), from Nuevitas,  
etc., was in collision about 8 a.  
m., Thursday off South Ferry, New  
York, with an unknown four masted  
motor schooner; damage to the Olinda  
not serious. The motor schooner  
was probably the Chiquimula, which  
sailed for La Union and later returned.  
Boston, July 10—Boston's fleet of  
sailing vessels will receive a notable  
addition when the four masted schrs  
M. Vrasia Petros and Lucin P. Dow,  
now building in Maine shipyards, are  
ready for commission. The Petros will  
be launched at Thomaston July 25  
and the Dow at Rockland some time  
in August. The schooners are both  
210 feet long, 28 feet beam and 22.6  
feet depth of hold. They will each  
have a carrying capacity of 2,500  
tons. The new vessels are building  
for Crowell and Thurlow, of this city,  
and will be placed in the off-shore  
trade.

liberated for debt and will be sold at  
U. S. Marshal sale at noon Monday.  
Havana, July 10—American motor  
schr Santa Cristina was sunk Tues-
