Women's Hospital Aid Held Meeting

Expressed themselves yesterday as in sympathy with Doctors Who Are Urging Commissioners to Ask for Royal Commission—Other Business.

The Women's Hospital Aid at their meeting yesterday afternoon in the Board of Trade rooms passed a resolution expressing themselves entirely in sympathy with the St. John doctors who are urging the Hospital Commissioners to ask for a Royal Commission. A letter is to be written from the secretary of the Women's Hospital Aid to the Commissioners reminding them that this course was urged some time ago and requesting that the Commissioners come to some decision on the matter.

The meeting yesterday was largely attended, and at it time the discussion became heated. It is gratifying to notice the deep interest taken by St. John women in order that those who are ill shall be comfortable and well looked after. Mrs. E. Albertson Smith presided in her usual capable way and made several telling appeals for various objects. She referred to the excellent way in which the affairs of the Aid had been managed during her absence from the city.

Mrs. C. P. Sanford reported a balance on hand of \$4,310.46, and spoke of receiving a donation of ten dollars from the Y. W. P. A. for toys to be purchased for the children's ward of the General Public Hospital.

Mrs. Percy Thomson, the visitor for the month, was not present, but several of her committee, Mrs. Norman Bonfield and Miss Traversa, reported that Mrs. Thomson had supplied all the fruit and flowers for the month. Magazines had been taken as usual.

Mrs. George K. McLeod was appointed visitor for the coming month. It was announced that ladies of the Mission church had offered to visit the hospital this month.

The resignation of Miss Ruth Gleason was reported, and it was decided not to fill her place until the annual meeting.

The denominational reports were as follows: Anglican, Mrs. Stewart Skitter; St. Paul's W. A., a donation of ten dollars; two life members, Canon and Mrs. Kuhnberg from Stone church, the gift of the stone church Red Cross Society, and five associate members.

Roman Catholic—Mrs. J. H. Dooey, three members.
Methodist—Mrs. Vermer McEldan, two life members, Mrs. A. P. Crockett, Mrs. H. A. Corbett, one donor, three members.

The secretary was asked to write the Stone church Red Cross Circle thanking them for their generous contribution.

Mrs. Moore, of the Salvation Army, spoke of the fact that arrangements are made with the officials so that all patients when convalescent from the hospital will be cared for at the McLeod. The president asked all visitors to the hospital to make this clear to salaried staff that they might know they had a home to go to until they were well or able to leave port.

For the magazine committee Miss Traversa asked that smaller magazines such as Life or those having complete stories should be donated. It was stated that the bookcase presented by the Aid had not been given a place and a committee are to ask if it will not be possible to find a suitable place where the books for the patients may be kept on the shelves. Permission was asked before the bookcase, which is a fine one was sent to the hospital.

The need of a recreation room where the men could smoke was brought before the meeting by Mrs. B. K. Smith, who said that Dr. Heidon had stated that a portion of one of the balconies off the ward could be partitioned off and heated so as to make a convenient room. The opinion of the Aid was that, while they felt such a place was badly needed, it was unwise to spend any amount of money on the hospital in the present state.

Mrs. Dunson Smith brought in the house committee's report, stating that at a quarterly meeting of the board all necessary linen had been ordered for the hospital. Two down suits and pyjamas had been donated at the request of the Aid by the Provincial Red Cross. Mrs. Smith felt that ad-verse criticism of the hospital did more harm than good. The visitors were most kindly received and found the hospital greatly improved. A large amount of painting and cleaning had been done, and things were in excellent condition. Another member of the house committee, Mrs. Morris, testified in the same way. Mrs. Smith and her committee were given a hearty vote of thanks for the splendid report brought in.

Mrs. A. C. Shefferson moved that the Women's Hospital Aid, representing thousands of women in St. John, ask the Lieutenant-Governor for a Royal Commission to see if improvements could not be made in the hospital. This was seconded by Mrs. Vermer McEldan. Mrs. Smith moved, seconded by Mrs. Morris, as an amendment, that a committee should interview the commissioners and ask them to ask for a Royal Commission, and that a time should be appointed when they would give an answer to this request. The amendment carried by a large majority.

It was decided that the Aid send greetings to Dr. Murray MacLaren on his return home.

New Brunswick Heroes Decorated

One Hundred of Province's Bravest Sons and One Honored Daughter Given Decorations—Large Crowd of Spectators Present.

The beauty and chivalry of New Brunswick was present yesterday afternoon at the vice-regal investiture in the Amorys, when nearly a hundred of the province's bravest sons and one of her honored daughters, were given the decorations bestowed upon them by the empire in recognition of their valiant services during the great war.

Lieut-Governor Pugsley, who made the presentation on behalf of His Majesty the King, spoke of the part Canada had played in the world conflict, and the deeds of the men present, who, winning the admiration of the entire country as representatives of the bravest and best who have stood on the battlefields, he had the pleasure then of awarding with official recognition for their loyalty and devotion to duty and their sacrifices on behalf of the nation. He made touching reference to the heroic dead, and then called upon General Macdonnell to announce the names of the men who had won decorations, and as each man answered to his name His Honor shook him by the hand, pinned the decoration upon his breast and congratulated him upon receiving recognition for his services. Colonel A. H. Powell, A. G., and Colonel Sparling, G. R. O., assisted in distributing the medals and citations.

Among the guests inside the hunting-decorated inclosure were Premier Foster, Major Hayes, members of the city council, Mr. Barker, secretary to the governor, and others.

In the gallery, reservations had been made for Mrs. Pugsley, Mrs. Foster, Mrs. Hayes and other ladies, and the attendance was so great that every vantage point was occupied.

As the medallists appeared before the presentation committee, salvoes of applause rang through the auditorium, and in facing the throng and the inevitable more reticence and nervousness than they ever did while performing the heroic tasks for which they have been decorated.

Proceeding and concluding the ceremony, appropriate numbers were furnished by the Great War Veterans' Band.

Among the recipients of decorations, not listed in yesterday's report, were Major J. A. MacMillan, who received the long service medal and A. O. Skinner, who received the Order of the British Empire on behalf of his son, Major Skinner.
