

Matriculation.

The regular Matriculation Examination begins on the day named in the Calendar.

Candidates for Matriculation will be required to pass a satisfactory examination in the following subjects :

I. **Latin.** Cæsar, Gallic War, Book I. ; or Books II and III. ; Vergil's *Æneid*, Book I. ; Cicero, two Orations against Catiline, or the Manilian Law ; Latin Grammar (Harkness' is preferred) ; Smith's *Principia Latina*, Part IV : Exs. 1-25, or the equivalent.

II. **Greek.** Dr. Smith's *Initia Græca*, Part I. ; Xenophon, *Anabasis*, Book I. ; or Book IV. ; Greek Grammar (Hadley's or Goodwin's is preferred.)

III. **Mathematics.** Arithmetic ; Algebra to the end of Quadratic Equations ; Geometry, as in Hamblin and Smith, Books I.-IV. (inclusive), or the equivalent thereof.

IV. **English.** Grammar, Writing from Dictation ; and a short composition upon a subject drawn from one of the following works : Shakespeare's *Julius Cæsar*, and *Merchant of Venice* ; Longfellow's *Evangeline* ; Macaulay's *Lays of Ancient Rome*. The composition must be exact in expression, division into paragraphs, punctuation, and spelling.

V. **French.** 23 chapters in Otto's Grammar, or an equivalent.
