GLEN, FRANCIS WAYLAND. (*South Ontario.*)

Of Scotch descent. Ancestors from Paisley, Scot., originally. S. of the Hon. E. M. K. Glen, who lived near Rochester, N. Y. Born near Albany, N. Y. Ed. at Rochester, N. Y. M., at Rochester, to the dau. of the late Joseph Hall, 1863. A manufacturer. First returned to Parlt. at g. e. 1878, and re-elected at last g. e. A Reformer.—*Oshawa, Ont.*

GORDON, DAVID WILLIAM. (*Vancouver.*)

Grands. on paternal side of John Gordon who emigrated from Coventry, Eng. to India, and thence to America, served in the Royalist Forces during the Revolutionary war, removed with other U. E. Loyalists to Can. and finally settled in the Township of Camden, Co. of Kent, Ont. S. of Michael Gordon, who, with his brothers, served in the Militia, under General Brock at the taking of Detroit; was at the Battle of Chrysler's Farm, and other engagements during the war of 1812, 13 and 14. His residence and crops were destroyed by the American General, Harrison, when he ascended the River Thames in pursuit of Gen. Proctor and Tecumseh.
