Best All Round Athlete Michelle MacWhirter, Swimming



Michelle MacWhirter adds the best all round athlete award to her already large haul of recognitions: AUAA Women's Swimmer of the Year; UNB Female Swimmer of the year; CIAU Athlete of the week ... And yet this remarkable season, which included three gold medals at the AUAA championships, a 4th place finish at the CIAUs and the AUAA record in the 100 backstroke, is not over yet. Yesterday she left for the Canadian Olympic trials in an effort to qualify for the Atlanta games.

Male Athlete of the Year Terry Pomeroy, Wrestling



Over his five years of competition for UNB, Terry Pomeroy has gone undefeated at the Pit (LB Gym) and in AUAA competition (68-0) at his 52kg weight. Terry captained the team for four years, represented Canada abroad and won five age group national titles. He also took home Wrestling MVP honours for the third consecutive year.

Female Athlete of the Year Tammy Jewer, Field Hockey & Charla Currie, Field Hockey



Tammy Jewer completed her Varsity Reds playing career with a share of the Female Athlete of the Year award. The first team CIAU All-Canadian, was also AUAA Player of the Year. She also received the Gail Wilson award from the CIAU as the player "whose leadership and performance has been instrumental in the overall performance of her team."



Charla Currie has also finished her Varsity Reds career. The fourth year graduating student has been the AUAA MVP, an AUAA all-star and a first team CIAU All-Canadian two successive years. While she lead the AUAA in scoring on grass, she was third in the league in her second sport of ice hockey, playing on the UNB Women's team.

Male Rookie of the Year Simon Orr-Ewing, Men's Basketball

Simon Orr-Ewing made quite an impact during his first season. The team's leading scorer and rebounder was voted to the all-star team at two tournaments, as well as making it to the 2nd team of AUAA all-stars. The basketball team's MVP had his single game high (39 points and 22 rebounds) when playing against Curtis Robinson, AUAA Player of the Year.

Female Rookie of the Year Jolene Bourgeois, Field Hockey

The UNB Field Hockey rookie of the year is also UNB's female rookie of the year. The AUAA all-star and 2nd team CIAU All-Canadian midfielder who started every game of the year for the V-Reds, placing third on the AUAA's scoring list.
