Edenvale: 08:00 hrs, ceiling 2000', visibility 10 miles. Flying washed out at 17:00 hours. Flying time 57:15 hours. Protestant services were held at 08:00 hours and 11:15 hours in the Station Theatre. Roman Catholic services: Early mass held at 07:00 hrs. and a church parade held at 11:15 hrs. in the Airmen's lounge. Jewish service was held in the Army Area Y.M.C.A. at 10:00 hours. A Christian Science Service was held in the Y.M.C.A. Chapel at 09:00 hours.
