letter of the 9th instant, No. 82/26, regarding the claim of Michel Morrisean to a portion of land in the Paskonkin Indian reserve, near Hungry Hall, Ont., and beg to inform you that this matter was taken up by the Department in 1891. It was then decided that Michel Morrisean's claim should be allowed, and that the area allotted to him should be arrived at, if possible, by an amicable agreement between the band, Michel Morriseau, the Indian Agent and the Surveyor who it was then intended to send the following season.

Lands Department, Ont., to obtain a portion of land from that Department in exchange for the portion to be taken from Paskonkin reserve. In that correspondence it was proposed to allow Morriseau 160 acres. The Department of Grown Lands, Toronto, neglected to reply to the last two letters from this Department, and the matter was then allowed to drop.

Enclosed herewith is a copy of a plan, as then
part of the instructions to be given to the surveyor, on
which the land proposed to be given to Morriseau is shown.

The Department is still willing to allow Morrisean his claim, and its boundaries may be any form desired by himself, provided that the Indian Agent and Council
