I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of Your Grace's communications of the 19th and 20th ultimo.

With enclosures in reference to the teacher of the Lake St.

Martin Day School. In letter of the 19th ultimo Your Grace asks what salary the Department intends and to offer for a teacher at Sandy Bay (Lake St. Martin).

In reply I beg to say that this is the first intimation the Department has had of any change. I may inform
Your Grace that a very satisfactory report on Mr. Pevel's
work for the past year was recently received. This report
showed a decided improvement in the standing of the children
in their class-room work and, as Your Grace may be aware,
Mr. Pavel has always maintained a splendid attendance. In
view of these facts the Department does not consider it would
be advisable to entertain the question of a change at the
present time.
