Reverend Sir,-

With further reference to your letter of November 12th with regard to the construction of a freezer and ice-house to be used in connection with the school for the storage of fish, venison and other foods which have to be kept throughout the year for the use of this institution, I beg to say that in view of the explanation furnished the Department, and the advantages which will be derived from the installation of this plant, it has been decided to give your request immediate consideration.

Would you therefore kindly furnish the Department with a sketch of the proposed building, also a list of the quantities and price of all materials, machinery, etc., required for the construction of the above mentioned plant and where they could be purchased so that the work might not be unnecessarily delayed. I would also be grateful if you will add any other information describing how the work could be economically carried out to the best advantage of the Department, the expenditure provided for the construction of this building being limited to a definite amount.
