CHAPTER XIX

AUGUST 13th 1888

The death of the just is precious in the sight of God and also in that of men; - those who have given edification during life should edify in their death; first crisis: - the lesson given by the dving: - Sisters vie with each other in tending the dear patient; - her spirit of prayer; -- dialogue with Sister of the Immaculate Conception ; -- a complication ; -- Extreme Unction; - last Viaticum; - it brings peace; - from the Asylum to Fullum Street : - inauguration of the Infirmary; - example to those who will suffer and die there; -- the 3rd of August, another alarm; -- 7th August, a new crisis; -- the 8th August, Father Caron says Mass for her; - the evening of the 13th; - her agony; - the Te Deum; - she expires; - the remains are exposed; -- coincidences; -- the newly professed in presence of the dead : - the funeral ; - in the cemetery at Longue Pointe.
