SCHOOL BOARD HOLD SESSION

Meeting of the Trustee's Receive Civic Auditor's Complimentary Report

Secretary McNab Greeted by the Board— Will Consider Teachers' Salaries

A short and business-like session of the Public School Board was held last evening.

The chairman expressed the satisfaction and pleasure of the members of the Board to have with them again their valued secretary.

The report of the Finance committee was then adopted as follows:

A letter was read from Miss Mildred Broadbent resigning her position in the Central school kindergarten with the end of the month.

Mr. Corvick said the Kindergarten committee had accepted the resignation with regret, as Miss Broadbent's services had been appreciated.

The action of the Kindergarten committee was approved.

A new map of the Dominion was received from the Government on instructions of Geo. Stephens, M. P.

On motion of Trustees Bray and Benson the matter of the Board were tendered to Mr. Stephens.

The report of Auditor Macpherson re School Board finances was read and showed a surplus of \$809.60.

On motion it was referred to the Finance committee with power to publish.

Dr. McKeough alluded to the item in the report which drew attention to a mortgage for \$800 which had been sold for \$700.

It will be seen that the enrolment is 11 less than for September and one less than for October, 1902, while the average is 33 less than for September and 43 less than for October last year.

The decrease in attendance is altogether in McKeough school, and is due to the outbreak of diphtheria, which has caused a stampede in some of the classes.

On motion of Messrs. Cornish and Benson, Miss Mounter's salary was raised to \$385, in accordance with the five year rule, raise to date from the beginning of the year.

Mr. McCorvie moved that the teachers of McKeough school be re-engaged for the ensuing year.

The Chairman—At the same salary. Mr. Heyward—No, no. Nothing was said about salary.

Mr. Paxton—Isn't that rather an indefinite way of doing business. Mr. Heyward thought the matter of salary should be dealt with later.

He believed that certain recognitions should be made, and he would like to see the Board look into the matter. Mr. McCorvie thought it was unnecessary to say anything about salaries.

Dr. Bray suggested that they appoint them at the same salaries and if it was decided later to make any changes it could then be done.

Mr. Heyward asked if it was fair to the teachers to leave the matter thus indefinitely. He suggested if the Board did not wish to act at the meeting that the teachers of the whole city be re-appointed and a special committee appointed to look into the matter of salaries and report at the next regular meeting.

This suggestion was on motion finally adopted.

It was then decided on motion of Trustees Paxton and Bray, that the special committee consist of Dr. McKeough, Dr. Bray, Mr. Cornish, Mr. McCorvie, Mr. Paxton and the chairman.

Mr. McCorvie drew attention to the necessity for flushing sewers at the school.

On motion it was referred to the managers, with power.

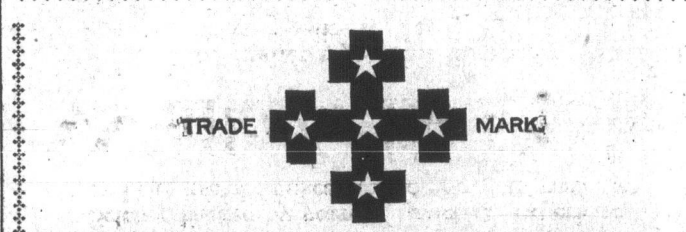
