HOME INSURANCE CO. DENIES INTENT TO RESTRAIN TRADE

Files Reply to Petition Asking Courts to Compel Company to Sever its Relations With Underwriters' Association.

Washington, January 11 .- Admitting that it is engaged in trade in the District of Columbia, but denying that at any time it has unlawfully designed or intended to restrain trade in this jurisdiction, the Home Insurance Company of New York filed answer on Saturday to the Jesse W. Towne petition to compel the company to sever relations with the Underwriters'
Association of the District of Columbia.

The plaintiff claims that the Underwriters' Associa tion is a combination in restraint of trade, and sues under the provision of the Clayton bill. The insurance company, through its attorney, admitted its membership in the Underwriters' Association, but denied that the purpose or effect of the association was to restrain trade in the District or elsewhere.
