BRITISH, FRENCH, AMERICANS AND ITALIANS STRIKE HARD Events Moving With Dramatic Swiftmess in Battle Zones

THREE BLOWS DEALT HUNS ON WEST FRONT; AUSTRIANS ARE IN FULL FLIGHT FROM ITALY

Diaz Submits His Armistice Terms To Austrian High Command, And Cessation of Hostilities Is Imminent; French, British And Americans Smash Foe Lines In France And Belgium

By Courier Leased Wire. NEW YORK, Nov. 2.—The Associated Press this morning issued the following: "Events are moving with dramatic swiftmess in the battle zones of France and Italy."

PERSHING SMASHES FOE General Pershing's army northwest of Verdun tore the German lines to pieces west of the Meuse river by a terrific attack yesterday morning.

THE FRENCH ATTACK West of the Argonne forest the French troops, under command of General Gouraud, attacked along the Aisne river, north of Vouziers and made rapid progress toward Le Chesne, a very important railroad point.

British divisions south of Valenciennes struck a swift blow yesterday, and that city is now virtually surrounded.

Further north British and French units continued their advance toward the Scheldt river. Little resistance was encountered, the enemy being engaged in retreating from the territory between the Lys and the Scheldt.

Advices as to conditions in Austria are confusing. It seems however that the imperial government is powerless in the crisis which has come at Vienna.

Reports from Germany are contradictory. Emperor Wilhelm has gone to the front and has been followed there by Vice Chancellor Del-

BAVARIAN ROYAL FAMILY CLAIMS GERMAN THRONE IN EVENT OF KAISER'S ABDICATION

Berlin Notified of Bavarian Demand by Premier of That State BULGAR KING QUILTS Boris Abdicates the Throne Which He Ascended Not a Month Ago PEASANTS FORM GOVT.

By Courier Leased Wire. London, Nov. 2.—The Bavarian premier has notified Berlin that the Bavarian royal family claims the imperial throne in the event of Emperor William's abdication, according to the Socialist Leipzig Volks Zeitung, which is quoted in a Hague dispatch to The Daily Mail.

Boris Quits Throne Copenhagen, Nov. 2.—King Boris of Bulgaria, who ascended the throne on October 3, has abdicated. A peasant government has been established at Tirnova, under the leadership of M. Stambuliski, who has been the chief of the peasants and agrarians of Bulgaria for some time.

Count Julius Andrassy, the Austrian Foreign Minister, Resigns HELD OFFICE A WEEK Count Karolyi Heads New Hungarian Ministry at Budapest

New Hungar Ministry Basel, Nov. 2.—A new Hungarian ministry has been formed at Budapest, Count Michael Karolyi, president of the Hungarian Independent Party, is the premier and Count Theodore Paththy is foreign minister.

OFFICIALS SATISFIED WITH LOAN FIGURES

Complete Returns for Thursday Raise Total to \$119,050—Many Subscriptions Which Cannot Be Made Public as Yet

Returns for yesterday's Victory Loan canvassing were unobtainable at noon to-day, but the complete figures for Thursday totalled \$119,050, which is a decidedly better showing than the \$45,000 reported yesterday, from incomplete returns for Thursday.

DEATH ROLL OF NINETY EIGHT IN BROOKLYN TRAIN DISASTER
