

## Notice of Application To the Legislative Assembly, Ontario.

NOTICE is hereby given that at the next session of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario application will be made by the Corporation of the Village of Waterdown for an Act to validate By-law Number Two Hundred and Twenty-two (222) of the said Village, authorizing the issuing of debentures for Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) for the erection and equipping of a Memorial Hall. The existing debenture debt of the Village is as follows:—

By-law No. 186, \$5000. For Hydro Electric, of which there is unpaid \$3331.25.

By-law No. 102, \$1500. For extending Hydro Electric, of which there is unpaid \$1000.21.

By-law No. 205, \$1500. For extending Hydro Electric, of which there is undaid \$706.20.

By-law No. 217, \$55000. For Public School, of which there is unpaid \$52484.41.

By-law No. 227, \$20000. For Public School, of which there is unpaid \$19512.15.

The Corporation of the Township of East Flamboro has to pay the Corporation of the Village of Waterdown one half of the debentures unpaid under the two last mentioned by-laws.

## New Branch

### Waterdown Vets Organized Last Friday

At a meeting of returned men held in the old school on Friday Feb. 3rd a new branch of the Great War Veterans' was formed, and will be known as the Waterdown and District Branch.

A. F. Smees, president of Central branch, Hamilton, and a member of the provincial executive was chairman of the meeting while D. Thompson, also of Central branch, acted as secretary. President Smees, in opening the meeting, explained the aims and objects of the G. W. V. A. and those entitled to membership.

The necessary routine of forming the organization was speedily settled, and the election of officers took place. The following were elected: Capt. E. S. Sawell, president; C. Gaultby, first vice-president; H. Nichol, second vice pres; L. Gaultby, sec-treas; H. R. Clarke, sergeant-at-arms. The executive committee is composed of Comrades P. Mitchell, W. Mitchell, W. Rockett, F. Jackson and T. McDonald.

Comrades, A. Cripps, of Burlington who is vice-president of the Hamilton district command, Comrades Gray and Law, also of Burlington and Comrades Thompson and F. W. Ambrose, of Central branch, Hamilton, delivered brief addresses. The newly elected officers also spoke briefly, expressing confidence that the new branch would be a big success.

Before the meeting adjourned it was unanimously voted that the branch would become affiliated with the Hamilton district command of the G. W. V. A., and that meetings would be held every third Friday of the month.

## Big Fire in Waterdown Next Saturday

The Foamite people will give a demonstration of their Firefoam here on Saturday afternoon of this week. A building will be erected on Mr. Cummins lot on Dundas street and several bales of straw placed in it. About 40 or 50 gallon of gasoline will be applied to the building and contents, and at 3 o'clock the building will be set on fire. When the fire is well advanced Foamite will be applied, and if the claim of the company holds good, the fire will be extinguished in 30 seconds. A general invitation is given the residents of Waterdown and vicinity to witness this demonstration.

## Leaves Large Estate

Included in a list of wills entered in the Surrogate Court this week for probate was that of George Baker, who was an old Waterdown boy, having served the town as Reeve about 30 years ago. Following his term of office he left for Chicago, where he resided until his death just recently, leaving an estate valued at \$233,722.56. Of this his wife is to receive a life interest, and at her death a son, Orrin, is to receive one-half and two daughters, Olive Irene Hochschild and Annette G. Mittel, will receive one-quarter each. Two brothers, Frank and John, reside just north of Waterdown.
