THE MINISTERIAL VISIT.

It appears now that Sir Wilfrid Laurier, the premier, will not be included in the ministerial party which will visit Dawson in August. This conclusion must be regarded as a distinct misfortune.

The government in many instances has been compelled to listen to the advice of selfishly interested parties or act without advice of any nature whatsoever. Under such circumstances there is little cause for surprise that mistakes of a most serious nature have been made at times by the government in attempting to legislate for this territory so many thousands of miles distant from the fountainhead of authority.

Were the premier to accompany his ministers to Dawson during the present summer, the Yukon territory would be able to rest assured thenceforth that its peculiar conditions were thoroughly understood by those in whose hands its interests are directly consigned.

LESS THAN THREE WEEKS. The possibility of supplying the Dawson market with fresh fruits, vegetables, etc., during the summer has been clearly demonstrated. As will be found explained in detail in our local columns, 50 cases of oranges picked from the trees less than three weeks ago are now being sold by local dealers.

The manner in which all such luxuries are purchased when they are to be had, would indicate that a profitable field is open for a lucrative business to someone who is familiar with the peculiar conditions which need to be met.

Trouble at Skagway.

There were very few developments in the longshoremen's strike Sunday and yesterday. A crew of non-union men was obtained to discharge the cargo of the Danube, as told in Sunday morning's issue, and she was gotten away at 6 o'clock in the evening, which was about the time Agent Dunn expected to get her out before the labor difficulty arose.

The Dolphin was provided with 22 non-unionists by Agent Frank E. Burns and he says there were more applicants than he could give work to.

The fight, however, is not over, according to some of the union men. They think the surplus labor in the city will be greatly reduced in a few days now that navigation is open, and then they expect the steamship companies, which will be doing a big business in freight, much of which will have to be handled expeditiously, will be more ready to consider a proposition to advance wages to the figure demanded by the strikers.

The situation is now that plenty of men can be had to discharge the cargoes at 50 cents per hour straight, which has been the ruling price and which the agents are willing to allow. How long this condition of affairs will remain cannot, of course be told, but with talks with some of the agents yesterday it would seem that no great amount of alarm is felt for the future.
