The Faculty Recital.

The Faculty Recital of Acadia Seminary, given at the Assembly Hall, on Monday evening, Dec. 16, was attended by a large audience.

Miss Martha Burmeister opened the program with Chopin's Scherzo in C sharp and rendered this difficult composition in a very creditable manner.

Miss Louise Paulsen, the violin teacher, made her debut with the first movement of a Sonata in E minor by Sjoegren.

Mr. Ringwald in his delightful rendering of Chopin's Polonaise op. 53 received a well earned recall, to which he responded with Valse de Concert by Wieniawski.

In the Rhapsodic Nocturne No. 14, he revealed a delicacy of touch as well as strength, fine musical feeling, finished technique which assured his place as one of the best pianists at Wolfville.

Miss Goodspeed in the 'Falcon' by Tennyson achieved a distinct success. Her conception of the character was noble and the interpretation most artistic.

Miss Portia Starr filled the role of accompanist in a most satisfactory manner. Plenty of opportunity was given her to show her musical qualities and technical attainments in the violin sonata which with its peculiar rhythm, is difficult to interpret.
