Members of the Navy League should find a new pride in wearing the membership badge. The North Sea surrender was the final act in the greatest chapter in naval history. For four years the British and allied fleets kept the seas free for allied and neutral trading ships.

The Hen.

Poultry and eggs alone could pay Canada's National War Debt, says Mr. Fred C. Elford, Superintendent of the Poultry Division of the Dominion Experimental Farm, Ottawa. And he produces the following figures to prove it.

"Canada's net national debt on October 31st, 1918 was \$1,247,000,000. We have adopted the slogan, 'One hundred hens to every farm, ten hens to every urban lot.' That would mean taking 1,000,000 as the round number of Canadian farms.

"At the present time we consume in Canada 23 dozen eggs per head of population per annum in Canada. We could increase this allowance to 5 dozen, a total of about 356,000,000 dozen. We use less than 25,000,000 dozen of our eggs at present for incubation. Suppose we increase this to 50,000,000 dozen. That would total 400,000,000 dozen for Canada's consumption, a very liberal allowance. We would then have left for export 700,000,000 dozen at an average price would bring \$280,000,000 per year in to the country from eggs alone.

"I do not say that Canada will do this. But I say that Canada might well aim to do it, for it is within the possibilities of what could be done without undue strain upon our present labor capacity."

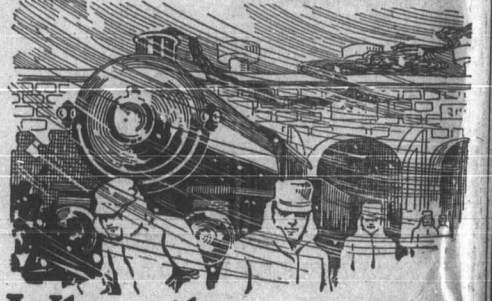

Mr. Vaughan Henshaw, who spent the past summer in Alberta and Saskatchewan with a survey party, returned home last week and will resume his studies.

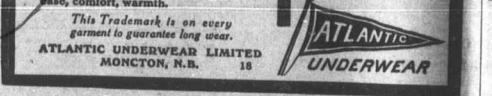

Kentville did splendidly and won a crown for its flag.

District No 3 included Berwick, Waterville and Cambridge, with a district to the south, and one north to the Bay of Fundy including Harborville. To this district the sum of \$3,000 was allotted and subscribed, the district winning two flags and possibly a third.

District No 4 comprised the township of Aylesford. For this the allotment was \$6,000 and the sum of \$97,350 has been subscribed. Two flags have been won, while Kingstons has the honor of obtaining the first flag in the county.

District No 5 included Wolfville and all of the section east of the road leading to White Rock and south to the county lines. The amount allotted to this district was \$20,000, and the amount subscribed was \$372,550. Each sub-division of the district won a flag and crown for its flag.

The county chairman desires to convey his thanks, not only to the district chairmen, but to all the canvassers and other workers who endeavored to bring the campaign to a successful conclusion.
