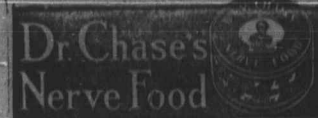

Origin of a Title

The eldest son of the reigning monarch of Great Britain and the heir apparent to the Imperial throne is always known as the Prince of Wales. It is the only case in which the title of prince as applied to a member of a royal family is a territorial one, and the story of how it came into existence has been told many times, is one of the most picturesque incidents in English history. King Edward I, one of the early Empire builders, ended the long series of wars between the English and the Welsh by bringing Wales into the union. In the conference, at which peace was concluded with the people of Wales, King Edward promised to give them a prince who could not speak a word of English. Evidently the prejudices of language existed then as they do today. Anyway the offer seemed to have pleased the Welsh, but they discovered that the canny king had played them a trick. It was true that the eldest son of the royal household could not speak a word of English, but when he was presented to the Welsh chieftains they found that their prince was a new born baby, who spoke no words of any language.
