FLEET'S PACIFIC CRUISE IS FOR PRACTICE ONLY

American Navy Secretary Gives Official Reason in His Annual Report,

(Special to the Morning Graphic.) WASHINGTON, Tuesday—That the oming cruise of the big battleship feet of the United States Navy to Pacific waters is intended "as a substitute for the comparatively short cruis-ing and the harbor work which the fleet has engaged in for the winter is the official explanation of the much discussed movement, as given in the annual report of Secretary of the Navy Metcalf, issued to-day.

Says the report: "Shortage of of-ficers and men made it necessary some time ago to discontinue all training-ship cruises; so that recruits now pass to general service with only a few months' training, all given on shore. Although by this system the recruits their sea duties, their development will perience being acquired by long cruises in regular service, as in the coming royage to the Pacific.

Messelik II, emperor of Abyssinia, has sent to the court of Italy a number of delegates on a weighty diplomatic mission. His majesty was born in 1844 and claims to be a direct descendant of Solomon by the queen of Sheba. He had a severe struggle to get his place on the throne, the famous Theodore, overthrown by Great Britain in 1888, having long stood in his way. Menelik came to his own in 1889, after he defeated the Emperor John. He has had a varied experience with the powers, extracting from the Italians the appalling capitulation of Adowa. After a period of pro-French sympathies he favorably received the British mission under Sir Rennell Rodd in 1888, and since that time he has been very friendly with Great Britain. Menelik has no direct hetr. So we shall see what we shall see when he dies. The diamond solitairs earring whire adorns the lobe of his left ear signifies that he has killed an elephant and that he is of royal birth. Political institutions in his country are essentially of a feudal character, being analogous to those of medieval Europe.
