London, July 21--The Morning Post, whose appeal for an airship for the Government has thus far brought only £2,500, announces that it has placed an order for an airship with Lebaudy Freres, who have built four dirigibles for the French army and one for Russia.

FUTURE OF THE SHAH. Russia to Provide Him With a Palace Near Moscow. St. Petersburg, July 20--The newspapers state that the Government has agreed to provide a residence for the ex-Shah of Persia and has offered him the palace built at Kelags, 95 miles southwest of Moscow, by Empress Catherine, for the last khan of the Crimea.
