Farm and Garden.

How Hemp is Grown and Prepared for Market.

Hemp is one of the minor crops of the country, like hops, confined to a few localities, very important in the limited districts where the cultivation is understood...

The Hemp Plant (Cannabis Sativa), belongs to the nettle tribe, and is often seen as a weed about farm houses in the older States...

The plant requires a deep, rich, vegetable loam, and is sown in alluvial districts, and river bottoms. It flourishes best in virgin soils, where it frequently yields ten or twelve hundred pounds per acre...

Water plowing is also recommended, and the seed should be sown in rows, and the rows should be spaced at four or five feet apart...

When the plants are pulled and the female plants thinned out to six or eight inches apart in the drill. Care should be taken not to pull the staminate plants, until they have discharged all their farina, and fertilized the pistillates.

The plants being thinned, the ground is kept under tillage, between the drills, with the plow or cultivator, and the drills are cleaned with the hoe. After the first light frosts, the plants are gathered, and carried to the barn for threshing...

The earliest sown Hemp, is usually ready to harvest about the middle of August, and later fields will ripen in the order in which they have been planted.

There is a diversity of practice as to the mode of harvesting. The old method was to pull it up by the roots, and this process had the advantage of recommending it, that it saves some four or five inches in the length of the stem, when it is thinned and best...

In other cases, the plants are laid on the ground with great care, and left for a few days to cure. They are then gathered and put in shocks, and tied in a cap at the top, with a wisp of straw.

Several attempts have been made to remove the woody fiber from the flax by machinery, without the loss of time involved in retting, but without success. The thing has been done, but the flax for some reason does not last so long and its market value is damaged.

For some purposes, the water retted hemp is much the best, and commands the highest price. This need for ships' cordage goes through this process. Notwithstanding the advantages of water retting, flaxseed can be very profitably raised from the fact that it is more troublesome, requires more skilled handling, and sometimes commands a premium over the seed of water retting...

A Waterfall Six times the Depth of Niagara.

Did any of your readers ever hear of the Gairroppe Falls, near Florence? If not, they will probably read a description which has just appeared with some pleasure. It is curious that a fall six times the depth of Niagara should remain almost unknown.

The village of Gairroppe, reached by a river of the same name, the river was carried for twelve miles up the Malinnesse Pass, and reached the Falls Bungalow about three and a half hours after leaving the top of the Pass.

An amphitheatre of woods, and a river, about 200 yards wide, rushing and boiling to a certain point, where it is lost in a perpetual mist and in unceasing eddies, you see directly before you two out of the four principal falls; these two are called "the great falls," and "the Rocket," the one contains a large body of water, the main body of the river, perhaps half a mile across, which falls massively and apparently sluggishly into the chasm below; and the other contains a smaller body of water, which shoots out in a foaming spray over the edge of a rock which it falls into the same chasm.
