St. John Aids Soldiers. St. John Council has voted \$200 to the European War Veterans' Association.

Dealers who bought the stolen goods were fined \$40 an \$850 respectively. A boy who stole newspapers was let go on suspended sentence.

Bib Burner at French Fort Cove. McInnes & Sons of St. John are building a \$7000 refuse burner for J. D. Buckley at his French Fort Cove Mill.

He has two brothers at the front, one with the 58th Howitzer Battery, which is stationed at Fredericton, and another brother with the 165th. This patriotic family belong to Middle Sackville the father being Mr. Denis Bourque, of that place.

General Assembly Meeting Today. The general assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada meets this year in Winnipeg beginning its sittings this evening. It is expected that more than 500 of the ministers and elders of the church will be in attendance—one sixth of the membership of all the Presbyteries in Canada. The Commissioners-elect of the Presbytery of Miramichi are Rev. D. Henderson, Rev. John Harris, Rev. Alex. Cruise, Rev. Walter McN. Matthews and Messrs. A. R. Matthews, Geo. Vanderbeck, Jas. Henderson and R. McMillan, elders. All these gentlemen will be present except Mr. Henderson, whose place will be taken by Rev. Alex. Rettle, Clerk of Presbytery, Rev. Prof. Bdrd of Manitoba College, and Rev. Dr. Nall of Toronto have both been nominated for the Moderatorship and the choice will be made at the first sitting of the Presbytery.

The much discussed question of Church Union will again receive attention, as the Church Union Committee has recommended by a majority of 19 to 12 that the church should commit itself definitely to the consummation of the union immediately after the general European war shall come to an end.


