#### HALIFAX ELECTION POSITION

OTTAWA. The Halifax election has been postponed under authority of the Electoral Measures Act. The date of polling will be held has not yet been determined, but January 21 is the likely date.

#### PROBABLY ALL LIES

BERLIN. (Official). In reply to the statement of British Foreign Secretary Balfour in the Commons on December 12 that Great Britain in September received through natural channels a communication to the effect that Germany would be prepared to get in touch with Great Britain regard to peace, there was issued today a statement as follows: "At the beginning of September the German Government through the medium of a neutral government received an inquiry relating to Germany's views on the communication of the British Government was couched in a form that, according to international usages, it might be supposed to indicate that the neutral inquiry was made with the knowledge and approval of the British Government. However, the circumstances under which the inquiry was made allowed the German Government to be drawn with the greatest probability that the British Government has been informed of the fact and that it had been sanctioned by the British Government. The German Government was in principle to answer the inquiry to do this two courses were open: indirect or a direct reply. The latter a decided objection against the reply through the medium of a neutral as the medium might constitute a decided restriction of Germany's freedom without any guarantee in return for the opponent's attitude, that is indirect. A verbal reply through an intermediary appeared to be the most opportune course to follow in view of the trend of subsequent events, which forced the conviction on the German Government that the opponents nothing was being done to facilitate such a direct reply to the inquiry. Regarding the utterance of Great Britain mentioned by the Secretary Balfour about its desire to receive any communication from the German Government, the news of this reached the German Government only in a private statement in the Commons. A further statement in an affair was not made on the same day.

#### WHY GERMANY IS MAKING EFFORT.

LONDON. The Premier Lloyd George, while speaking at a dinner of the Great Benches, said: "If this is the moment, it is because Russia has stepped out and America is only passing to come in. Every hour passes will see the gap formed by the retirement of the Russians and the valiant sons of the Great Republic. Germany knows it, hence the desperate effort they are making to force the issue before America is ready."

#### ONLY ARTILLERY BURNING

PARIS. Today's Statement issued to-night by the War Office reads: "On the Western Front a moderate artillery action was reported to-day. There was infantry activity."

#### STORMS ISOLATE B.C.

WINNIPEG. The British Columbia is isolated from the outside world so far as line telegraph communication is concerned. Sleet storms of unusual violence, both in the mountains and between Vancouver and Seattle, have cut down many miles of telegraph lines. All the telegraph companies are affected and it may be some days before regular communications are restored.

#### LOYD GEORGE SPEAKS TO POINT.

LONDON. Today's desired goal is being made by the lies despite some untoward occurrences. Because of this fact, Premier said, he would regard any overtures to Prussia at the moment that her military spirit was so high with boastfulness a betrayal of the spirit of himself and his colleagues. The Premier's words were, "Because I am firmly convinced that despite the outward events, despite discouraging appearances, we are making steady progress toward the goal, I would regard peace overtures to Prussia at the very moment the Prussian military spirit is drunk with boastfulness as a betrayal of the great trust with which my colleagues and myself have been charged." If Russia persists in her present policy, he pointed out, withdrawal by the enemy from the east of a third of his troops must release hundreds of thousands of men and masses of material to assist Great Britain, France and Italy. It would be folly, he added, to underestimate the danger, an equal force exaggerate it and the greatest danger of all not to face it. The Russian democracy has decided to abandon its struggle against military autocracy. The American democracy is taking up Germany's victories were disproportionate to the world, the Premier said, but her troubles did not appear in the bulletins. Something was known of them, however. The death grip of the British Navy was making its effects, and the value of her troops was making an impression which would tell in the end. He said that those who during the past forty years were organizing a nervous breakdown in the nation were the same as those who recently were organizing an insurrection over the Flanders territories. Lloyd George said he was glad to understand that Lord Lansdowne was in agreement with President Wilson. I also, declared the Premier, agree with the President and do not desire to force a controversy.
