

### NEWFOUNDLAND TRADE FIGURES MONTREAL, Dec. 6.

Considered misleading in respect to he present trade situation in Newoundland, the figures given at the annual meeting of the Bank of Montreal here on Monday, showing imports exceeding exports during the year ending June 30, 1921, are supplemented in a report issued ssued today by A. W. Wiseman, acting British Trade Commissioner here in which it is submitted that the present trade situation in NewfoundInad shows an excess of exports over imports. Re marking that the figures given in the Bank of Montreal report are quite out of date, Mr. Wiseman said the figures of the total trade transacted during the year ended June 30, 1922, shows a more healthy aspect, the total exports being again in excess of imports. This year the total imports amounted to \$18.209.853 as compared with exports

#### of \$19,478,417. The exports from Newfoundland, said Mr. Wiseman, have been in excess of imports every year since the beginning of the war, with the exception of the year ending June 30, 1920 and 1921.
