HOW MCCARTY STARTED, ROSE TO BE CHAMPION, AND DIED IN THE RING

LUTHER McCarty, who met his death on Saturday, was twenty-one years of age. He reached his majority on the seventeenth of last March. He was born in Hastings, Nebraska.

His mother died when Luther was eight years of age. From that until he was sixteen he travelled with his father around the country selling patent medicines. His father is an "Indian Doctor" known as White Eagle. The name and supposed nationality, however, was only assumed as there was no trace of Indian blood in his veins. When Luther last heard of his father he was in Platte, Ohio. This was just one week before the Dayton flood. It was reported that he was one of the victims, although no confirmation was received of the support.

Luther began his pugilistic career here in Calgary where it ended. He was billed as the "Calgary White Hope." The date of his first fight was April 17, 1911. He met a well known old fighter by the name of Joe Grim that day. The referee declared the bout a draw. McCarty received twenty-five dollars for this contest.

The date of his second fight was May 5, 1912. McCarty won his first fight of any consequence when he knocked out Carl Morris who was billed as the real white hope of the world. From that time on, just a little over a year, the McCarty-McCarthy combination has made money.

McCarty's claim to the white championship of the world is based upon the popular approval of the scheme of Tom McCarthy of Los Angeles to determine the heavy weight title by an elimination process. McCarty, Tim Flynn and Al Palmer were selected to be the men who should fight it out among themselves for the honor. McCarty surprised the world when he defeated Flynn on Dec. 10, 1912, less than a month later outclassed Al Palmer. He was acclaimed by the world's press as the champion of the world. The last five months have been Luther's triumph. Everywhere he went money has come to him easily. Prosperity did not seem to affect him. During this time he has made over twenty thousand dollars, half of which went to his manager. He saved practically every cent he made and states to his friends here last week that he had ten thousand dollars in the bank in San Francisco. All of his money was in the bank. He was the only one of the three who had no decision affairs of short duration. On April 15, 1913, he decisively beat Jim Flynn for the second time and on April 26, got the newspaper favor Frank Moran in Philadelphia. He came directly from Philadelphia to Calgary.

Arrangements were completed the day before his death for him to go on the vaudeville stage at a salary of \$2,500 per week.

ROBIN HOOD APPLICATION FOR CROSSING REJECTED

The application of the Robin Hood Milling Co. for a third street track across Fourth street west was unanimously rejected by the Railways and New Industries committee in view of the fact that Fourth street is one of the chief cross thoroughfares of the city. There is a proposition to build a subway at this crossing of the C.P.R. and it was felt that the city would be making trouble for itself; the city solicitor, however, thought that the subway would not necessarily be interfered with, and the company's representative stated that the company would agree to take up the spur at any time the city saw fit.

Ald. Gordon intimated that a permanent subway was not to be thought of. The matter was finally referred to the city solicitor for report.

The company wished to have the matter ratified by the Railway commission, which site here on May 28, it may be taken before that body without the acquiescence of the committee.

DISORDER AT SUFFRAGETTE DEMONSTRATION AT LONDON EAST END

Many of Women Had Their Clothing Nearly Torn Off in Trouble Which Ensued

London, May 26.—Victoria Park in the east end, was the scene of a rioting today when trades unionists and Socialists attempted to hold a demonstration in support of votes for women. Fifteen platforms had been erected and were elaborately decorated. The crowd stormed a and other militants and dragged it outside the park.

Mounted and foot police, by repeated charges, finally drove the crowd away. Women were chained to the iron railings and several were trampled upon. Many of the women were carrying flags and banners. There were innumerable free fights and the standard bearers were kept busy.

Suffragists paraded with their colors, caps. The mob tore the decorations from the platforms and carried away the flags as souvenirs.

On Saturday suffragettes attempted to blow up Wheatley hall at Doncaster, owned by Sir Wm. Cook. The plan was unsuccessful. They exploded a bomb, and suffragette literature was found under a stairway.

While a Chicago lawyer was defending a pickpocket in the police court, his client relieved him of a roll of bills. The usual touching plea for clemency was omitted.
