The bylaw did not regulate the shape of loaves.

Ald. Parnell said he would not speak as if he knew "Baker Parnell" at all. He explained that the bylaw was not really what bakers thought it was. He said that although customers received loaves weighing probably one-half or one ounce light they were not defrauded, but received the required amount of dough. None but Vienna loaves should be allowed to be made under two pounds in weight.
