FEDERATION TO BACK THE BOMB SUSPECTS Will Take Charge of Defense Fund To Be Raised by Labor.

Indianapolis, May 1.—Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor, arrived Saturday, and immediately went into secret conference with 40 labor leaders of national and state organizations.

A meeting of the executive council is to be called soon by Mr. Gompers, who said the session probably would be held in this city. Further, that this Mr. Gompers would not talk regarding the action of the labor leaders.

Outside the local labor men present, William J. Spencer, secretary of the building trades department of the federation, and Frank L. Mulholland, of Toledo, attended. Mr. Mulholland is an attorney for the national organization and probably will be one of the lawyers for the defence of the three labor men now in jail in Los Angeles, Cal., for their part in the Times building.
