

CAMP ORDERS THAT AFFECT
TRANSFER TO CAMP BORDEN

PROVINCIAL ELECTION, PERTH COUNTY.
Officers commanding units are directed to grant leave of absence from midnight, Friday, 7th instant, to midnight, Monday, 10th instant, to all ranks desirous of exercising their franchise at the marginally noted election. This leave to be granted irrespective of any movement to Camp Borden.

Officers commanding units will arrange to draw one day's extra rations, to be taken with the troops.

All camp equipment and articles issued to troops for their use in camp are to be taken with them, except field kitchens, which are to be returned to Ordnance Stores.

Soldiers under sentence of detention are to be handed over by the Officer in Detention Barracks to an escort from their unit, and will be taken to Camp Borden.

N. C. O's and men detailed for garrison military police, are to be returned to their units on the morning of the day fixed for departure.

Horses are to be shipped on Sunday. Groves are to be left behind to look after the horses, and will report to the P. V. O.

Rear parties from each unit, with the exception of the 185th and 186th Overseas Battalions, consisting of one officer, and 25 other ranks, will be left behind to clear up the camp grounds. The rear parties will leave by special train on Sunday, with the groves and horses.

The 16th Overseas Battalion will take over the duties of the duty battalion, commencing tonight, 7th instant, and is also detailed as duty battalion for the ensuing week.

SIDELIGHTS ON
CAMP SITUATION

Military orders received yesterday provided for the removal of the 110th (Perth) Battalion last night, and before the bye-election in North Perth is held next Monday.

Orders given to The Advertiser as late as 10 o'clock last night provided for the removal of the 110th (Perth) Battalion last night, and before the bye-election in North Perth is held next Monday.

There was considerable protest over this as the Perth men did not wish to be deprived of their votes. Consequently, according to the last order received, men were able to secure the privilege of exercising their franchise, although they cannot understand why the attempt was made to get them away before the election.

"This is contrary to the assurance I received from Sir Sam Hughes," said William Gray, M. P. Scrap of paper Billy.

"It is a shame that the city has been treated this way," said another John M. Moore. And the local Tory paper quoted him. But the same paper is dumb as an oyster about the breach of faith with the city.

"Something approaching consternation was observed in the city hall," says a local paper. But the mayor of London was as complacent as the well-known clam.

"On the faith of promises that all Western Ontario troops would train here the city has spent nearly \$30,000 on the camp grounds," says a local paper. But why not call attention to the breach of promise suit that the city should start.

"It certainly is a bad position in which to leave the city after going to so much expense in connection with the camp," said George H. Bolton, president of the board of trade. "We were not surprised that some consternation should be observed, but we rather expected that. But to take eight out of eleven battalions was more than we anticipated. We should have at least eight battalions here. It does not seem fair to London."

"It will be a serious loss to London," said Philip Pocock. "We should have been told in the beginning what we were expected to do. It seems unfair, very unfair, to take the men away from London at this time."

"It is a serious matter," said Controller Gammage. "We went along on our preparations, spent our money freely, and did all we could to make the camp suitable, on the full understanding that the troops would be left here. It was a bone-fide agreement, but now it has been broken. It does not look as if we can do much, but it is a serious condition of affairs."

"It is an outrage," declared W. T. Strong. "Are agreements of no value any more?" asked Thomas Rowe.

"We did our duty," said Ald. E. S. Little. "We have the finest camp in the province, and the men are satisfied. Sir Sam said that we have done more for the soldiers than any other city. It looks as if we have done it in a good way. I always thought an agreement was something to respect."

"The men undoubtedly could get as good training here as at Camp Borden," commented Mayor Stevenson.

"We still hope to keep the major portion of the camp," commented J. P. Moore.

NOW TENTLESS UNIT

London's Own Now Ready for

RETURN TO OLD ORDER
License Holders Believe They
Will Be Compensated—
Soldiers Barred.

It is probable that the hotelmen will cancel the order, by which only malt goods, ales, lagers, and porters can be sold from 6 to 9 o'clock (city time).
