The Home Chef's Suggestions for Tomorrow's Menu

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PEACH JAM.
Peel and remove the stones from six pounds of firm ripe peaches, slice and place in a preserving kettle over a slow fire; stir and cook one hour; remove from the fire and press through a sieve; return to the fire and add five pounds of sugar and one-quarter of the peach kernels blanched and chopped. Boil for twenty minutes, stirring constantly and skimming off foam. Pour into hot jars, seal and store in a cool dry place.

STUFFED TOMATOES.
Peel and chill six large, firm, ripe tomatoes; with a sharp spoon remove all of the pulp and seeds, leaving a solid case; be careful and not break the sides. Mix one cupful of grated pimento cheese with two tablespoonsful of chopped, chopped, pitted ripe olives, two tablespoonsful of finely chopped parsley, two tablespoonsful of salt and one cupful of Russian dressing. Fill the tomato cases with the mixture set on lettuce-covered plates and serve very cold.

ORANGE BISCUITS.
Mix in a saucepan three-quarters of a cupful of the boiled beef stock and four tablespoonsful of butter; stir and cook until the butter is melted, stir in one tablespoonful of ragon vinegar, one tablespoonful of orange juice, and one teaspoonful of French mustard. Stir and simmer until the sauce is thick, add two

tablespoonfuls of finely chopped parsley and four tablespoonfuls of finely chopped sour pickled cucumbers. Simmer two minutes and serve.
CURRENT MERINGUE PIE.
Beat the yolks of two eggs with one cupful of sifted sugar until smooth, add to them one cupful of steamed and mashed currants, two tablespoonfuls of water, and one tablespoonful of flour; mix well, pour into a pastry lined pie pan and bake in a moderate oven until set. Remove from the oven, cool, cover with a meringue made of the stiffly beaten whites of two eggs and four tablespoonfuls of sugar; set in the oven until lightly colored.
