THE DOMINION ESTIMATES.

COST OF RUNNING THE COUN-TRY THIS YEAR.

South London-Two large residences, with Promises of Economy Redeemed-Large Decreases fin Controllable Expenditures.

Special from our own correspondent.

Ottawa, Ont., April 29.-The estimates laid on the table this afternoon Scottish Agitation Against the Embargo on deemed its promise to control the con-The celebrated LESLIE Fruit Farm, situated on trollable expenditures as much as is consistent with the requirements of the public service. The total amount asked for consolidated fund is \$1,682,-693.91 less than last year. The amount chargeable to capital account is \$412,-155 less than last year; so that the total reduction is over two million dollars. It happens, however, that the amount of the debt to be redeemed next year is \$1,627,652 more than last year, so that the total amount to be entered and authorized by statute and for redemption of debt is \$467,196 less than last year. The total amount chargeable to consolidated fund is \$36,834,458; total chargeable to capital, \$4,408,960. (An extended summary is crowded out of this issue.)
