The family tinware was spread on the floor to catch as much of the water as possible, and the inmates of the house took up quarters on the sidewalk until the heaviest of the storm was over and the water in their domicile had abated.

Only one school suffered, that being the Parkdale Public school. It was some four inches deep in the basement during Sunday afternoon, which by yesterday was reduced to two inches.

The cellar of the Bell clothing store was turned into a small pond, and more or less damage was done.

Taylor Bros. & Co., 60 Adelaide east, and Mr. Ellingsworth, 62 Adelaide east, are among the sufferers by the flood, their cellars being subject to the common complaint of flooding.


