WHEAT CLOSED STRONGER.

Toronto Bank Clearings Are Unusually Heavy—Money Firmly in London—Little More Activity in Ontario Grain—Wheat Cables Irregular—Cotton at New York Lower.

Thursday, October 26. Canadian Pacific sold up to 77 in London today, but closed at 75 1/2.

There was a rally in the rates for sterling exchange this afternoon, but they still await profit to improve of gold.

A cable says that discount rates in London are rising and that the Bank of England price of eagles has been raised.

Money in London on call is 1/4 to 1/2 per cent. Bar silver in London is 39 1/2 per ounce.

The adjustment of Canada is predicted after the passing of the repeal bill, probably about the middle of next week.

The gold in the United States Treasury shows a slight increase, the total now being \$85,000,000.

The financial situation is promising. The report of the silver bill seems assured, and confidence in the part of money lenders is returning.
