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We have been informed by the Secretary of the Charlotte County Agricultural Society, that a letter has been received by the President from Professor Johnston, in answer to the invitation sent to him by the Society to visit this County, from which the following extract is taken:

"It will give me great pleasure to comply with the request of yourself and the Committee, on my return to New Brunswick, in October. I cannot at present fix the time when I can be with you; but as soon as I can, I shall communicate with you."

J. Brown, Esq., M.P.P., writes as follows:—"We have already travelled 345 miles in the valley of the St. John above Fredericton, and extended our inspection as far as the Little Falls at Madawaska. The crops are abundant, and neither rust nor fly in grain, nor blight in the potatoes. The drought has been felt here, and still continues, but in passing up the river, its effects gradually disappear."

Montreal, Aug. 27, P.M.—At a meeting of the Executive Council it was said to be determined to return the seat of Government here, and to keep the Horse Police out of the city. M. Lafontaine and Merritt have left for Halifax, supposed on business of the Custom House League.

Liverpool Timber Market, August 18.—Deals are recovering from the very low prices at which they have been for some time past. Since the 27th ult., ten cargoes of Quebec yellow Pine Timber have been disposed of at prices ranging from 13d. to 17d. per foot, according to average, size, and quality, and red Pine at 16d. to 17d. per foot. Two cargoes of St. John Spruce Deals at 17s. per standard, with Pine Deals at 19 10s. per standard, and Pine Boards at 110 per standard.

Postage between Halifax, Boston and New York.—A treasury warrant is printed in last Tuesday's Gazette, directing that in future the postage between the above-named places shall, after the 20th September next, be fixed at a packet rate of 4d. for every letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, and so on, progressively, 4d. for every additional half ounce. Newspapers are to be charged 1d. each, provided the usual postal regulations respecting newspapers be complied with.

From Havana.—Barque Admide has just arrived in the lower Bay, bringing later dates. Rey had been detained by the Government of the United States through Mr. Campbell, and was surrendered by the Governor-General to the Consul, and sent to New Orleans, in company with Dr. Gage.

French West Indies.—Admission from Guadaloupe, to the 12th inst. state that a serious fight had occurred between the whites and the blacks, in which the former had gained the advantage, but were leaving the country, in dread of further conflicts.

A large fire occurred in Philadelphia on Friday morning, which destroyed over one million feet of lumber.

It is estimated that over one thousand vessels are now employed in the mackerel fishery between Boston and Cape Sable.
