## CONTRACTS OPEN.

MELBORO, QUE.—An Episcopal church will be built here.

COWANSVILLE, QUE.—There is an agitation for a fire station.

VERNON, ONT.—P. Dallish will build a residence this summer.

KERWOOD, ONT.—W. Downing is preparing to erect a residence.

KENTVILLE, N.S.—A public building, to cost about \$15,000, will be built here.

WYOMING, ONT.—There is a movement on foot in favor of securing electric light.

IROQUOIS, ONT.—A proposition to furnish electric light has been made by Mr. Keele.

MIDDLE STEWACKE, N.S.—T. B. Davidson is making preparations to build a house.

ARNPRIOR, ONT.—John Cunningham is preparing to build a storehouse and dwelling.

RIVER HERBERT, N.S.—It is expected that the Dominion government will build a wharf here.

BAIE ST. PAUL, QUE.—A company is being formed to build a chemical pulp mill here.

JERSEYVILLE, ONT. R. A. Dunham is about to build a new store and hall.

THREE RIVERS, QUE.—The city has invited tenders for the purchase of \$25,000 of debentures.

BEAUPORT, QUE.—L. M. Grenier will receive proposals up to 14th inst. for a loan of \$75,000.

MERRITTON, ONT.—The town will put down a sample macadamized roadway, at a cost of \$2,000.

LA PATRIE, QUE.—There is talk of building an electric railway between here and Scotstown.

CARLUKE, ONT.—It is expected that the erection of a new church will shortly be commenced.

PORT ELGIN, N.B.—The Presbyterians will build a church this summer. Rev. Mr. Fraser, pastor.

FIFTHWOOD, ONT.—The trustees of the church are considering the carrying out of improvements.

EDMONTON, N.W.T.—G. Gallagher is calling for tenders for building a two-story brick store, 26 x 60 feet.

PORT ARTHUR, ONT.—The erection of a building for Mr. Morgan will likely be commenced this week.
