McDonald (Shediac), Moraud, Mullins, Pope, St. Père, Sinclair, Stevenson and White, have been appointed a Committee to superintend the printing of the Senate during the present Session, and to act on behalf of the Senate as Members of a Joint Committee of both Houses on the subject of the Printing of Parliament.

On motion of the Honourable Senator King, it was-

Ordered, That a Message be sent to the House of Commons by one of the Clerks at the Table, to inform that House that the Honourable the Speaker, the Honourable Senators Beaubien (*Montarville*), Fallis, Haig, Hardy, Howard and Robinson, have been appointed a Committee to assist the Honourable the Speaker in the direction of the Restaurant of Parliament, so far as the interests of the Senate are concerned, and to act on behalf of the Senate as Members of a Joint Committee of both Houses on the said Restaurant.

On motion of the Honourable Senator Aylesworth, it was-

Ordered, That the petition of Sophie Kohen, of Toronto, Ontario; praying that a Royal Commission be appointed to investigate alleged grievances; that certain public Acts be amended, and that a new trial in the courts be granted her, presented to the Senate on the 1st February, 1944, be referred to the Standing Committee on Standing Orders for consideration and report.
