DESIGNATION OF MEMBERSHIP OF LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEES

Hon. Ray Hnatyshyn (President of the Privy Council): Mr. Speaker, having had consultations, I should like to draw a third item to the attention of the House. I think Your Honour will find disposition to receive the particular order and to have it passed without debate, by unanimous consent. It reads:

Notwithstanding any previous reports of the committee appointed to prepare and report lists of membership to compose the legislative committees, that the membership of the following legislative committees be as follows:

Bill C-42, an Act to dissolve Canagrex and to amend certain Acts in consequence thereof—Althouse, Binns, Blais, Cardiff, Clark (Brandon-Souris), Foster and Fraleigh.

Bill C-45, an Act respecting employment and employer and employee relations in the Senate and the House of Commons—Cassidy, Copps, Crouse, Ellis, Grisé, Lewis and McGrath.

Bill C-87, an Act to authorize the divestiture of Canadian Arsenals Limited and to amend other Acts in consequence thereof—Blackburn (Jonquière), Boudria, Bradley, Daubney, Duguay, Hovdebo and Stewart.

Bill C-88, an Act to authorize the acquisition of Marine Atlantic Inc. and to provide for other matters in relation thereto—Angus, Cochrane, Forrestall, Gray (Bonaventure-Îles-de-la-Madeleine), Nowlan, O'Neil and Tobin.

Bill C-91, an Act to establish the Competition Tribunal and to amend the Combines Investigation Act and the Bank Act and other Acts in consequence thereof—Attewell, Cadieux, Domm, Howie, Kempling, Orlikow and Ouellet.

Bill C-92, an Act to regulate interests in petroleum in relation to frontier lands, to amend the Oil and Gas Production and Conservation Act and to repeal the Canada Oil and Gas Act—Champagne (Champlain), Gagnon, James, MacLellan, McDermid, Sparrow and Waddell.

Bill C-94, an Act to implement an agreement between the Government of Canada and the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador on offshore petroleum resource management and revenue sharing and to make related and consequential amendments—Johnson, MacLellan, McDermid, O'Neil, Price, Sparrow and Waddell.

Bill C-249, an Act to readjust the representation of Ontario in the House of Commons and to readjust the electoral districts in Ontario—Kempling, Malone, Penner, Plourde, Reimer, Rodriguez and St. Germain.

Bill C-250, an Act to amend the Auditor General Act—Hovdebo, Kempling, Malone, Nicholson (Trinity), Plourde, Reimer and St. Germain.

Bill C-251, an Act to amend the National Anthem Act—de Corneille, Kempling, Malone, McDonald, Plourde, Reimer and St. Germain.

Bill C-252, an Act to amend the House of Commons Act (estimates)—Deans, Gauthier, Kempling, Malone, Plourde, Reimer and St. Germain.

Bill C-253, an Act to amend the Bankruptcy Act (farmers and fishermen)—Althouse, Foster, Kempling, Malone, Plourde, Reimer and St. Germain.

Bill C-254, an Act to amend the Criminal Code (legal counsel for unborn child)—Kaplan, Kempling, Malone, Plourde, Reimer, Robinson and St. Germain.

Bill C-256, an Act to register lobbyists—Boudria, Kempling, Malone, Orlikow, Plourde, Reimer and St. Germain.

Bill C-257, an Act respecting the conservation, export and diversion of water resources—Blaikie, Foster, Kempling, Malone, Plourde, Reimer and St. Germain.

Bill C-259, an Act to amend the Federal Court Act, the Northwest Territories Act, the Supreme Court Act, the Tax Court of Canada Act and the Yukon Act—Kaplan, Kempling, Malone, Plourde, Reimer, Robinson and St. Germain.

Bill C-260, an Act to amend the Identification of Criminals Act (publication of cards)—Kempling, Malone, Nunziata, Plourde, Reimer, Robinson and St. Germain.

Bill C-262, an Act to change the name of the electoral district of Nunatsiaq—Guilbault (Saint-Jacques), Kempling, Malone, Murphy, Plourde, Reimer and St. Germain.
