In reply to your letter of July 18th, may I say that while it is true that at McGill we have a series of studies going on, under the general title "Unemployment", this is a university enterprise and has no official connection with the Provincial Government. The introductory volume of the studies by Mr. Leonard Marsh, the volume "The British Immigrant to Canada" by L. Reynolds, and the volume "Unemployment Relief in Western Canada" by Fred V. Stone, will be published this autumn, and other volumes are to follow.

I do not think that any of these volumes will give you the information you seek, but when Mr. Marsh returns to the University in about two weeks' time I shall ask him to write you.
