### RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- All articles must be entered with the Secretary one day previous to the Show. The Secretary will be in attendance on the Grounds at 8,30, on the morning of the Show.
- No horse, with the exception of brood mares or stallions to be exhibited more than once.
- All articles to be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and in classes E and F, the work of the exhibitor or some member of his family.
- All articles entered in classes C and D as varieties, to be named to the Secretary by their proper names.
- No person will be allowed to interfere with the Judges during examination.
- No article or animal shall necessarily entitle its owner to a prize unless deemed worthy by the Judges.
- All Grain, Roots, and Vegetables, must have been grown by exhibitor in 1887, and articles in classes E and F to be the manufacture of 1887.
- All articles and animals exhibited, are to remain until 4 o'clock on the day of the Show.
- Parties, not members, can exhibit on payment of \$2.
- No member or members of a family shall exhibit more than one article of the same kind in class E or F.
- Admission to show, for non-members, 10c.
- Any person removing or interfering with prize tickets or ribbons or damaging any articles exhibited, will be arrested.
- One dollar will be retained from prizes taken, for membership fee for 1888.
