GOOD PRICES PAID FOR DORSET SHEEP

Holsteins Also Disposed of at
R. H. Harding's Sale at
Thornedale.

THORNDALE, March 20.—(Special)

"Good prices for the Dorset sheep" was the popular comment on R. H. Harding's sale here today. Ten head of registered Holsteins were sold. The aged cows brought fair prices, while the young heifers and bulls sold very cheaply. Four aged cows averaged \$125. Two rising two-year-old heifers averaged \$135 each. Two yearling bulls averaged \$55 each. A bull calf sold for \$20 and a heifer calf for \$37. The Dorset sheep taken all together were a good lot and realized all they were worth, prize winners at last year's Guernsey and Toronto shows being among those offered. A pair of yearling ewes, first and second prize at Toronto, brought \$25 each; a yearling wether, first prize as a lamb at Guernsey Winter Fair, \$16. A registered Clydesdale mare sold for \$300. Thomas Clarke of London County was the auctioneer.

TO BEGIN MANUFACTURING AT NEW YEAR'S.

Abitibi Pulp and Paper Company Ltd.

Contract.

The Abitibi Pulp and Paper Company announce that their pulp mill will be in operation in January, 1914. The contract for this work was let some days ago and work at once started on the mill. The plant will have a minimum daily capacity of 180 tons of dry pulp. Later on the company will erect a modern paper mill, but for the first year or two their operations will be confined to the manufacture of mechanical ground wood pulp. Careful estimates made by engineers show that they have sufficient pulpwood to do them for 50 years. Their mill will cost \$1,600,000.
