
Comments on Hagel-Westlake Case Not Pleasing to Trial Judge.

WINNIPEG, April 1.—More echoes of the Nagel-Westiake trial were sounded this morning when Mr. Jus-tice Curran, who presided over the sounded this morning when Mr. Jus-tice Curran, who presided over the trial, took the newspapers to task for what he termed "misstatements of facts" which they had published. Ru-mors, he said, had apparently got abroad to the effect that the sentence was influenced by the attorney-general's department, and this Justice Curran denied. He referred to an editorial which had appeared in a Winnipeg evening paper of March 31, which had contained what the judge termed "certain mistatements of facts termed "certain misstatements of facts in regard to language or expressions I made use of in imposing the sentence in the Hagel-Westlake case."

He denied he had ever said to Hagel that he could, by good conduct, get out in a year and a half. He spoke of an "insuiting cartoon" which had appeared in a Regina paper as "most unfair," He stated that "if the liberty of the press is to be prostituted in this way, in future I shall take good care, at least while I am judge of this court, that these libertles are abridged."
