Western Judge Attacks Papers

Comments on Hazel-Westlake Case Not Pleasing to Trial Judge.

WINNIPEG, April 1.—More echoes of the Hazel-Westlake trial were sounded this morning when Mr. Justice Curran, who presided over the trial, took the newspapers to task for what he termed "misstatements of facts" which they had published. Rumors, he said, had appeared regarding the trial, and he had published them in a Regina paper as "most unadvised." He stated that "if the liberty of the press is to be prostituted in this way, in future I shall take good care, at least while I am judge of this court, that these liberties are abridged."

PAID IT BACK
