Annual Meeting of the Society
at the County Court House, at Seven
O'clock on Tuesday the 10th day of January,

was called to order by the Presi-
dent, Justice Street, who thereupon ad-
dressed the meeting, detailing fully the proceed-
ings of the Society for the past year, the state
of the Province, and the great benefit to be derived by
the Province from the Society if cheerfully and
actively supported, and the prospects of the So-
ciety for the coming year.

The Treasurer's accounts having been sub-
mitted and read.

That George Botsford and S. W.
Harris, Esquires, be a Committee to Audit the

Corresponding Secretary being called
upon by the President, recapitulated his report
of the Executive Committee, relative to the im-
provement of Stud horses, under the resolution
of the Legislature passed at their last session.

That the Executive Committee be
authorized to publish the whole or such parts of
their report embracing such parts of Mr. Cum-
mings as they may think generally use-
ful, and that the thanks of the Society be given
to the Executive Committee, for their report of his proceed-
ings in the purchase of Horses for the Province,
and for the Committee appointed at
their meeting in April last to report
on the alteration and improvement that may
be made in the Constitution of the Society, &c."

That the report be accepted.

That the salary of the Correspond-
ing Secretary for this year be at least £100, and
of the Recording Secretary £10.

SPECIAL COMMITTEES :

Resolved,—That Dr. Robb, David S. Kerr,
John T. Smith, John A. Beckwith, Jas. Taylor,
and T. R. Barker, Esquires, be a special Com-
mittee to enquire and report to this Society at
its meeting in April next, on the subject as
stated in the Society's Journal, pages 91 and 92,
in reference to the County of York, viz:—

1st. What Oat, Barley, and Flour Mills, res-
pectively, there are now in the County of York,
and what additional Mills of either sort required,
or may be set up and encouraged in such County
with advantage, together with suitable and con-
venient sites therefor.

2nd. What Household and Domestic Manu-
factures are now principally attended to in the
County, (such as carding, spinning, and weaving
of Cotton, Flax, and Wool, for wearing apparel,
carpetting, straw hats, straw bonnets, knitting,
needle work, &c., &c.,) and the probable amounts
thereof respectively, and how the descriptions
thereof may be best encouraged, increased, and
made profitable in such County.

3rd. What Manufactories respectively, there
are now in operation in the country, and what
additional manufactories, (such as

1st. Woolen Manufactories for all descrip-
tions of Woolens required for Home use.

2nd. Cotton Manufactories for the same, and
exportation.

3rd. Iron Furnaces, for the manufacture of Iron
in its various conditions, Castings, Stoves, &c.

4th. Salt Manufactories.

5th. Paper Manufactories, for making wrap-
ping, writing, sheathing, Printing Paper, &c.,
and Paper Hangings.

6th. Hat, Cap, and Bonnet Manufactories.

7th. Soap and Candle Manufactories.

8th. Tanneries.

9th. Leather Manufactories, for Boots, Shoes,
Harness, Saddles, Whips, Trunks, &c., &c.

10th. Potteries of all sorts for Home use.

11th. Brick and Lime Kilns.

12th. Hardware and Cutlery, Manufactories
for all kinds of iron vessels, implements and
edge tools.

13th. Rope Manufactories or Rope Walks.

14th. Manufactories for Waggon, Carriages
and other vehicles.

15th. Manufactories for Wooden wares, in-
cluding Household Furniture, &c.

16th. Manufactories for all kinds of Agricul-
tural Implements.

17th. Stone Manufactories for Grind Stones,
Grave Stones, Building Stones, &c.

18th. Fulling Mills for dressing Homespun
and other Cloth.

19th. Nail Factories.

20th. Cooper Manufactories for making of all
kinds of Casks, Tubs, Tierces, Barrels, half
